1. AGENDA

1. Craig Ogard to speak about issues on Halbrook Lane

Craig Ogard-3825 Halbrook Lane

- In September of 2023, residents came before the council to petition to close the street
- A petition was signed to close the street (39 of the 47 houses signed the petition)
- The quality of life (noise, walkability, and backing out of driveways) have all been affected due to the volume of traffic
- The street was not designed for this volume of traffic

Jaye Loggins-Police Chief

• Stats since 2024 (52 citations in relation to Halbrook and 44 at the intersection)

Sam Gaston-City Manager

- Met with Vestavia City officials along with Virginia Smith, Gerald Garner, and City Attorney Whit Colvin
- Vestavia is not in favor of closing off the street from a public safety standpoint
- Some other options discussed were: 1) Vestavia to extend sidewalk from where it stops south of the post office to Mountain Brook and then Mountain Brook take the sidewalk down Halbrook 2) Put up "No cut-through" traffic signs 3) Pass an ordinance to enforce the no cut-through traffic 4) Try to narrow the street in certain areas with striping 5) Contact Google to try to get them to reroute traffic back onto Crosshaven as opposed to Halbrook

Lloyd Shelton-Council Member

• The issue on Halbrook is traffic volume, the only way to address it is to close the road

Graham Smith-Council Member

- Concerned about unintended consequences
- The police and fire department stated they are uneasy with closing the road because it could lower their response times
- Vestavia is not in favor of closing the road and Mountain Brook does try to be a community partner with Vestavia
- Not opposed to closing the road; however, uneasy with closing the road without first trying some of the other options

Chris Mullins-Fire Chief

- Closing the road, closes off Vestavia (who is a close partner with Mountain Brook) that provides mutual aid to Mountain Brook
- It is not optimal for the Fire Department to close the road
- It would be a big impact on the Fire Department not having that thoroughfare
- It limits the fire department in helping one another city to city with Vestavia

Jaye Loggins-Police Chief

- It is not as big of an impact from the Law Enforcement side
- The police vehicles can get around easier than the Fire Department

Billy Pritchard-Council President Pro Tempore

- Share the same sentiments as Graham Smith and Lloyd Shelton
- If there is a consensus to move down the path of closing the road, then a plan needs to be made on steps and then shared with Vestavia

Whit Colvin-City Attorney

- The most drastic thing to do is to close the road when other options are available
- Would have to explore the legal steps to close the road
- Once a road is closed, it is vacated and the property belongs to someone else, it cannot be reopened
- If the city goes through the vacation process, it divests the road to the public and it would then belong to the adjoining property owners

Billy Pritchard-Council President Pro Tempore

- Not prepared to close the road at this meeting without giving some thought on how it can be done right
- Wants to fully understand the process and plan on closing the road in order to make an informed decision

2. Woodland Trail bridge over Shades Creek

Graham Smith-Council Member

- The Friends of Jemison Park presented the City with a bridge
- The Friends of Jemison Park has raised the funds for this bridge
- Once completed, the bridge will be turned over to the city to maintain

EXHIBIT 8

ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the City of Mountain Brook, Alabama (the "City") operates certain public parks for recreational use by the public; and

WHEREAS, the Park and Recreation Board of the City of Mountain Brook promulgates rules and regulations for ordinary use of those parks; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mountain Brook (the "City Council") has determined that it is in the public interest, and in the interest of the students, athletic participants and community members that use the City's parks that the parks should be closed for nighttime use, except as might be permitted in conjunction with authorized and approved events and overnight use of the parks should be prohibited altogether; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the City's Park Use ordinance to establish a closing time for all parks, to prohibit post-closing activities in the parks, except as may be undertaken in conjunction with authorized events, and to prohibit any overnight use in the enumerated areas will promote the public safety, health and general welfare of its students, athletic participants and coaches, employees, community members and all other persons who use such areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Mountain Brook as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 38 of the City Code shall be amended as by adding the following section:

"Sec. 38-2 – Prohibited activities in public parks.

- (a) All Parks, as defined herein, shall close thirty minutes after sunset, except for events scheduled or authorized by the Recreation Board of the City of Mountain Brook or the Director of Parks and Recreation. No camping or overnight use of any Park shall be permitted at any time. It shall be unlawful for any individual to be in or upon the premises of any Park after the Park closes, unless the individual is participating in an event authorized as set forth above.
- (b) For the purposes of this Chapter, "Parks" shall be defined as follows: Alabama Veteran's Memorial Park, Cahaba River Walk, Canterbury Park, Crestline Tot Lot, Irondale Furnace, Jemison Park, Mountain Brook Athletic Complex, Mountain Brook Presbyterian Church Trails, Nature Trail (Overbrook Road), Overton Park, Rathmell Sports Park and Watkins Trace Trail, all public property surrounding such parks whether posted or designated as a Park or not, and any other public place in the City designated as a park by the City Council.
- (c) It shall be unlawful to violate any of the terms and provisions of this section. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the said terms and provisions of this section shall, upon

conviction, be punished in accordance with Code of Ala. 1975, § 11-45-9 for a misdemeanor violation for each such offense. Each day any violation of this section shall continue shall constitute a separate offense."

Section 2. This ordinance is cumulative in nature and is in addition to any power and authority which the City of Mountain Brook may have under any other ordinance or law.

Section 3. If any part, section, or subdivision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such holding shall not be construed to invalidate or impair the remainder of this ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect, notwithstanding such holding.

Section 4. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the City Council of the City of Mountain Brook, Alabama which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be effective immediately after adoption and publication as provided by law.

JEMISON PARK IMPROVEMENT PROJECT CONTRACT WOODLAND TRAIL BRIDGE CONNECTOR

This Jemison Park Improvement Project Contract (the "Contract") is made by and between The Friends of Jemison Park ("Friends") and the City of Mountain Brook, Alabama (the "City"), effective as of the date last signed below by a party (the "Effective Date").

WHEREAS, the Friends of Jemison Park is a non-profit organization formed and dedicated to support Robert Jemison Jr. Park ("Park"), a preserved area located in the City that provides a mature treescape, a buffer to Shades Creek, a "gateway" into the City and recreational opportunities through the use of its sidewalks and trails:

WHEREAS, Friends has engaged in numerous improvement projects in Jemison Park and has, through its fundraising efforts, assisted with removal of invasive and non-native vegetation, conducted stream bank improvements, helped with the establishment of native trees and other vegetation and committed substantial funds toward a comprehensive improvement and rehabilitation project;

WHEREAS, the City, with the financial assistance of Friends, has recently constructed comprehensive improvements to the Park, including but not limited to improved sidewalks and accessible trails, the construction of new trails, flood mitigation measures and other improvements; and

WHEREAS, Friends has requested permission to have constructed a bridge and related improvements, which will provide a safe and convenient means of connection between pedestrian ways on both sides of Shades Creek along the Woodland Trail (the "Woodland Trail Bridge Connector") as set forth on and in Exhibits A and B to this agreement (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is in the public interest to permit Friends to proceed with the Project and to enter into this contract with Friends to set forth the terms, conditions and expectations attendant to such appropriation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the parties, the Friends and City agree as follows:

- Services. Friends shall have completed on its behalf the work in accordance with the Scope of Work and the Project Plans and specifications set forth in and in accordance with the terms, conditions, plans and specifications in Exhibits A and B (the "Services").
- 2. Compensation. No compensation shall be due to Friends by the City and the Project will be solely funded by Friends.
- 3. Term. The term shall begin when this Contract is executed by the City and will extend for one-hundred eighty (180) days (the "Term") from May 15, 2024 (the "Project Beginning Date"), during which time the Services must be completed, unless said term is extended by the City upon good cause shown by Friends. Notwithstanding any other provision herein, the Contract may be terminated before the expiration of its Term on the occurrence of any of the following:
 - (a) Termination for Cause by City. If Friends fails to perform any material obligation in the Specifications or this Contract (a "Default"), the City may terminate the Contract for cause on seven (7) days' advance written notice to

Friends and City acknowledge and understand that the Services will be performed by one or more Contractors selected by Friends and City gives its consent for Friends to enter into subcontractor agreement(s) for the work. Friends agrees to procure and provide to City waivers as to all materialmen, subcontractor or other liens related to the Project and to be solely responsible for
